The Fenton Aldeburgh First Collection Prize



This year, the Trustees agreed to a threeyear sponsorship of The Poetry Trust's Aldeburgh First Collection Prize. This was a new departure for the Trust, but the collaboration felt extremely relevant, with both organisations seeking to support artists at the beginning of their careers. Newly-renamed as the 'Fenton Aldeburgh First Collection Prize', it is the first UK award designed to recognise and benefit a poet at first book stage. As well as a cash award, the recipient is given a paid invitation to read at the Aldeburgh Poetry Festival, plus a unique week's paid protected writing time on the East Suffolk Coast.

The first Fenton Aldeburgh Prize recipient was Olivia McCannon, (pictured above), for her book 'Exactly My Own Length'.
